十诫 - 7 THE TEN COMMANDMENTS - 7

SECTION A

- 1. Hello, listening friends. 亲爱的朋友,你好,
- Thank you very much for tuning in to this broadcast.
 非常感谢你收听我们今天的节目。
- 3. It is a great encouragement for us to know that you are listening on the other side; 知道你在收听节目,对我们是一个极大的鼓励。
- 4. and I hope that you will write to us so that we can be in contact with you and you with us. 我希望你可以写信给我们,好让我们彼此进一步的沟通。
- 5. We have been doing a series of messages on the Ten Commandments; 我们这一段一直在讲有关十诫的系列信息;
- 6. and, today, we come to the Sixth Commandment. 今天我们要讲的是第六条诫命。
- 7. The Sixth Commandment is one of the shortest. 第六诫命是最短的一条。
- 8. "You shall not kill." "不可杀人。"
- 9. Why is the wording of this Commandment so important? 为什么这条诫命的措词如此重要呢?
- 10. Because there are eight words in the Hebrew language that are translated "kill;" 因为在希伯来语中,有八个词可以翻译为杀人:
- 11. and, yet, the word that is used, here, in the Sixth Commandment is unique and seldom used anywhere else.

 而在第六条诫命中,所用的这个词是非常独特的,很少在别的地方使用。
- 12. Why is this particular word used here? 为什么在这里要用这个特别的词呢?

- 13. Because the Bible makes a distinction between lawful killing and unlawful killing.
 因为圣经要将合法的杀人与非法的杀人区分开来。
- 14. The word that is used for killing out of self-defense is different from the word that is used in the Sixth Commandment.
 用于描述自卫杀人的那个词,与第六诫命中所用的这个词是不同的。
- 15. The word that is used for killing in times of war is a different word again.
 用于描述战争时期杀人的那个词又是另一个词。
- 16. They are all different from the word used here in the Sixth Commandment. 它们都与第六诫命中使用的这个词不同。
- 17. The Sixth Commandment is specifically directed to murder in cold blood. 第六诫命,特别指的是冷血地杀人。
- 18. The Sixth Commandment is specifically directed to killing with passionate rage. 第六诫命,特别指的是狂暴地杀人。
- 19. The Sixth Commandment is specifically directed to killing unjustly. 第六诫命特别指的是非正义地杀人。
- 20. My listening friend, please listen carefully. 亲爱的朋友,请留意。
- 21. The Sixth Commandment does not apply to killing purely for self-defense. 第六诫命不适用于完全出于正当防卫地杀人。
- 22. There is another word for that. 对于这种杀人另有一词。
- 23. The Sixth Commandment does not apply to the killing of animals.第六诫命不适用于宰杀动物。
- 24. There is another word for that. 它另有一词。
- 25. It does not apply to killing as in times of war. 它不适用于战争时期地杀人。

- 26. There's another word for that. 它另有一词。
- 27. The Sixth Commandment is specifically directed to the taking of life, unlawfully and unjustly. 第六诫命特别指的是非法,不正义地夺取生命。
- 28. Why is that? 为什么呢?
- 29. Because it violates God's sovereignty, 因为这侵犯了神的主权,
- 30. because He is the One who gives life 因为神才是赐生命的那一位。
- 31. and He, alone, can take life away, 只有祂才能取走生命,
- 32. because killing unlawfully robs God of His glory.
 非法杀人掠夺了神的荣耀。
- 33. Some of you may be saying to yourself, "I have never murdered anyone." 有些人也许会对自己说: "我从未杀过任何人"。
- 34. Well, most people don't see themselves as murderers;是的,大多数人都不认为自己是杀人犯;
- 35. and that is why I want you to turn with me to Matthew, Chapter 5, verse 21.因此,我想请你和我一起,翻开马太福音 5章 21 节,
- 36. This part of Matthew 5 is known as the "Sermon on the Mount." 马太福音的这一部分,也被称为"登山宝训"。
- 37. It is the greatest sermon ever preached; 这是所有的讲道中最伟大的一篇:
- 38. and it was preached by the Lord Jesus Christ, Himself. 它是主耶稣基督亲自宣讲的。
- 39. Here's what the Lord Jesus said: 主耶稣是这样说的:
- 40. "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not murder. "你们听见有吩咐古人的话,说,'不可杀人',
- 41. Anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.'
 又说, '凡杀人的, 难免受审判。'

- 42. But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment." 只是我告诉你们,凡向弟兄动怒的,难免受审判。"
- 43. To those who say, "I have never broken the Sixth Commandment," I want you to listen carefully.
 对于那些人,他们说: "我从来没有违背过第六诫命",我希望你留心听。
- 44. Jesus, in Matthew 5, is telling us something of vital importance. 耶稣在马太福音第 5 章,告诉我们一些非常重要的事。
- 45. He is saying that taking someone's life is murder, but also thinking of someone with murderous anger is equivalent to killing. 祂的意思是,夺取人的生命是谋杀,但对人动了杀人般的怒气也等于杀了人。
- 46. The Bible says that, if you break one Commandment, you have broken them all; 圣经说,如果你违背了一条诫命,也就违背了所有的诫命;
- 47. so, the only hope that we have is the forgiveness of sin by the Lord Jesus Christ, who kept all of the Commandments perfectly. 因此,我们唯一的希望,就是从主耶稣基督那里得到赦免,只有主完全地持守了所有的诫命。
- 48. The Lord Jesus is also saying something else. 主耶稣还讲到其他的一些事情。
- 49. At some point in our lives, all of us have become so angry at someone that we wish that they were dead. 在我们生命中的某一刻,都曾对某人非常的恼怒,以至于希望他死掉。
- 50. Jesus is saying that anger is a subtle form of murder.
 耶稣是在讲,怒气是谋杀的一种很微妙的形式。
- 51. It might not kill the body; 它也许没有在肉体上杀人;
- 52. but it can kill the soul and the spirit of another person. 但它可以杀害另一个人的灵魂和精神。
- 53. Hatred toward somebody can cause just as much damage to the soul of that person as a gun would kill a body; 对某人的仇恨在他灵魂中所造成的伤害,就好像用枪去杀害他一样;

- 54. so what Jesus is saying in Matthew 5 is this: 所以, 耶稣在马太福音第 5 章讲的是:
- 55. He is saying that murder is like the fruit of the tree, 谋杀就好比树上的果实,
- 56. and anger and hatred are the roots of the tree. 愤怒和仇恨则是树根。
- 57. Fruit does not appear from a tree that is rootless; 没有根的树是结不了果实的;
- 58. so Jesus is telling us that, when we deal with the root of anger in our lives, 耶稣是在告诉我们,只要我们能控制好生命中的怒气之根,
- 59. then the fruit will take care of itself. 那么树上的果实就会自然得到控制。
- 60. Most often, God is the only One who can see the roots of anger in our lives. 通常,唯有神才能看到我们生命中怒气的根源。
- 61. Sometimes, people cannot even see the root of anger in their own lives, 有时,人们看不见自己生命中怒气的根源,
- 62. but God does; 而神能看见;
- 63. and He tells us that, if we do not get rid of the root, sooner or later, the fruit will show up; 神告诉我们,如果不除掉这根,那么果实迟早会长出来;
- 64. and that is why the Bible speaks of the "root of bitterness."
 因此圣经中提到了"毒根"。
- 65. Did it ever occur to you? why the Bible does not speak about the "fruit of bitterness?" 你有没有想过?为什么圣经没有讲到"毒果"呢?
- 66. It is because the roots are hidden from view. 那是因为根是隐匿而不为人所见的。
- 67. The roots are underground; 根藏在地下:
- 68. and, because the root of bitterness is hidden from view, only you know about it. 因为毒根是隐匿而不为人所见的 ,所以只有你自己知道。
- 69. In Matthew 5, Jesus exposes the root of murder; 在马太福音第 5 章, 耶稣揭露了谋杀的根源;

- 71. My listening friend, please listen carefully to what I'm going to tell you. 亲爱的朋友,请你非常留心听,我下面所讲的。
- 72. There are basically three forms of anger. 从根本上来讲,有三种形式的愤怒。
- 73. First, there is the repressed anger; 首先,有被压抑的愤怒;
- 74. then, there is the resentful anger. 其次,有不满的愤怒。
- 75. Finally, there is the revengeful anger. 最后,有复仇的愤怒。
- 76. Let's look first at the repressed anger. 先让我们来看看被压抑的愤怒。
- 77. What does repressed anger look like? 被压抑的愤怒是什么样式的呢?
- 78. Well, it's like Job. 就好像约伯。
- 79. Have you read the Book of Job? 你读过约伯记吗?
- 80. Job kept on receiving bad news; 约伯不断得到坏消息;
- 81. but, in spite of all his bad news, he did not question God, 但尽管听到了所有这些坏消息,他并没有怀疑神,
- 82. and everybody was admiring Job; 每个人都佩服约伯;
- 83. but, then, came Job's comforters, 然后安慰约伯的人来了,
- 84. his so-called friends; 他那些所谓的朋友;
- 85. and his comforters came in and said to him, "Job, you must have done something wrong. 安慰他的人前来对他说: "约伯,你一定是做了错事。
- 86. You must have been so bad to get all of these bad things happening to you.' 你一定是非常败坏,以至于所有这些不幸的事临到你。"
- 87. At that point, Job's repressed anger flared up; 在那一时刻,约伯被压抑的愤怒爆发了;

- 88. and, instead of asking God, "Why?" He accused God falsely.
 他没有问神"为什么?",却责怪神。
- 89. This is a repressed anger; 这就是被压抑的愤怒;
- 90. but, then, there is resentful anger. 其次,是不满的愤怒。
- 91. There are people who never get over their resentments.
 有些人总是无法克服他们心中的不满。
- 92. Resentful anger causes all kinds of depression. 不满的愤怒造成了各类的忧郁症。
- 93. Some of you may remember the older brother in the prodigal story in Luke, Chapter 15. 也许你们还记得,路加福音 15 章中浪子故事里的那个大儿子。
- 94. We have brought you a series of messages on that story. 根据这个故事,我们曾作过一个系列讲座。
- 95. The older brother did all of the right things; 那个大儿子行事为人无可指责;
- 96. but he had such repressed and resentful anger inside of him toward his rebellious brother; 但他内心里对反叛的兄弟,有着很深的被压抑和不满的愤怒;
- 97. and, when his brother repented and returned to his father, 当他兄弟悔改回到父亲家中,
- 98. the older brother was so angry that he would not go inside the house; 大儿子非常生气,什至不肯进去;
- 99. then, there is a revengeful anger. 接下来,是复仇的愤怒。

- 1. Those are the people who want to get even. 有人总是想申冤报复。
- 2. In fact, the worse it gets for those people whom they hate, the happier they are; 事实上,他们所恨的人越倒楣,他们就越高兴;
- 3. but I would like to move from the problem of anger to a solution for our anger. 现在我想从愤怒所带来的问题,转移来谈谈解决愤怒的途径。

- 4. Let me give you three solutions to the anger problem. 我要告诉你,解决愤怒问题的三种途径。
- 5. Number one, 第一,
- 6. admit your anger. 承认你的怒气。
- 7. Number two, 第二,
- 9. Three, 第三,
- 10. control your anger God's way. 按照神的方式,来控制你的怒气。
- 11. First, admit your anger. 首先, 承认你的怒气。
- 12. Job had to come to the point of openly confessing his anger; 约伯不得不公开地承认自己的愤怒;
- 13. and, until he came to that point, healing could not have begun in his life. 直到他走到了那一步,否则,他的生命不可能开始得到医治。
- 14. Listen to what Job said, in Job 7:11, 让我们来听听,约伯在约伯记 7 章 11 节所 说的话语:
- 15. "I will speak out in my anguish of my spirit. I will complain of the bitterness of my soul." "我不禁止我口。我灵愁苦,要发出言语。我心苦恼,要吐露哀情。"
- 16. The Bible said, "Let your moderation be known to people and your needs known to God..." 圣经说: "当叫众人知道你们谦让的心。让神知道你们所需用的······"
- 17. but many believers reverse this idea. 可许多基督徒作的刚好相反。
- 18. They let all their needs be known to people and reserve their moderation for God. 他们将自己一切的需要告诉众人,而只对神保留谦让的心。
- 19. They feel that they should not bother God; 他们觉得不应该麻烦神;

- 20. but they want to bother everybody else who would listen to them; 而是去麻烦那些愿意听他们诉说的人;
- 21. but the good news is, Job confessed his anger to God, 令人欣慰的是,约伯向神坦诚自己的愤怒,
- because it is hard to deal with a problem if you do not admit it to God -因为你如果不向神来坦诚,就很难解决问题。
- 23. not because God does not know, 不是因为神不知道,
- 24. but He wants you to articulate it to Him. 而是神愿意你向祂清楚地陈述。
- 25. Why does He want you to confess your anger to Him? 为什么神愿意你向祂坦诚自己的怒气呢?
- 26. Because He and He, alone, is the One who can truly empower you to overcome your anger problem.因为只有神,才能赋予你能力,去克服你的 怒气。
- 27. Somebody said, 有人说:
- 28. "If you don't talk it out with the Lord, you will take it out on people."
 "如果你不向神来诉说,你就会向人发怨气。"
- 29. Anger is not the problem. 怒气并不是什么问题。
- 30. Some anger, very often, is legitimate. 常常有些怒气是合理的。
- 31. It is a legitimate and natural expression of our emotions; 它是我们情感的一种自然、合理的表达方式;
- 32. and that is why the Apostle Paul, in Ephesians 4:26, said, "In your anger, sin not." 因此,保罗在以弗所书 4章 26节中说: "生气却不要犯罪。"
- 33. He does not say, "Don't ever get angry." 他并没有说: "不可生气。"
- 34. No. 没有。
- 35. That would be unrealistic. 那是不现实的。

- 36. He said, "When you get angry, be sure you don't sin." 他只是说: "当你生气的时候,不要犯罪。"
- 37. Secondly, 第二,
- 39. If you give yourself time to think through the cause of anger in the light of the Word of God, 如果你能够给自己时间,靠着神话语的光照,来思想怒气的原因,
- 40. then, you will respond to anger in a godly way. 你就可以按照神的方式,来处理怒气。
- 41. If you allow the Word of God to put your mind in gear before you release the breaks of your mouth, 如果你能够在开口之前,用神的话语使自己的思维运转起来,
- 42. you will find yourself responding to anger with constructive ways, rather than destructive ways. 你将发现自己,可以采用建设性的方式,而不是破坏性的方式处理愤怒。
- 43. Listen to what James said: 请听雅各所说的:
- 44. "Be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to anger."
 "要快快地听,慢慢地说,慢慢地动怒。"
- 45. He did not say, "Don't get angry." 他并没有说: "不要动怒。"
- 46. He just said, "Be slow in the process of your anger." 他只是说: "在你动怒的过程中要慢一点。"
- 47. The third and the last thing is this: 第三, 也是最后一点是:
- 48. control your anger God's way. 按照神的方式,来控制你的怒气。
- 49. The best way to control anger God's way is to force yourself to pray for the person who is the object of your anger. 控制怒气最好的方式,也就是神的方式,是让自己为你所恼怒的人来祷告。
- 50. Pray for that person who made you angry. 为那个让你生气的人来祷告。

- 51. I know that it is not easy; 我知道这不容易:
- 52. but, when you ask God to enable you to pray for the person, He will do it. 但是,当你求神帮助你为那个人祷告的时候,祂一定会帮你。
- 53. I try always to begin my day with the words of the Psalmist, 我总是尝试用诗篇作者的诗句,来作为自己一天的开始,
- 54. "Let the words of my mouth and the meditations of my heart be acceptable to You…"
 "愿我口中的言语,心中的意念,在你面前
- 55. then, I go even one step further 然后我会更进一步,

蒙悦纳。"

56. and say, "Let the words of my lips and the meditation of my mind be controlled by You, O Lord..."

说: "主啊,愿我口中的言语,心中的意 念,为你所掌控·····"

57. and, when God is in control of the words of your mouth and the thoughts of your mind and heart,

当神掌控你的口和心思意念的时候,

- 58. then, they will be acceptable to Him. 一定是在神面前蒙悦纳的。
- 59. Let me repeat those three things again before I conclude.
 在结束以前,让我再重复一下这三点。
- 60. Admit your anger to God. 承认你的怒气,
- 62. Control your anger God's way. 按照神的方式来控制你的怒气。
- 63. My listening friend, 亲爱的朋友,
- 64. do this and you will cut off the root of anger and bitterness in your life before a murderous fruit is produced. 这么做,你就可以在杀人的毒果长出来之前,斩断怒气的毒根。
